

2010 CENSUS WORKERS NEEDED

Every 10 years, a census of our population is conducted. The results help determine how federal funds are spent in our community on things like roads, parks and other public services, as well as your representation in government. As a census taker, you'll help to make sure that everyone in our community is counted. A 2010 census job offers a lot: good pay, flexible hours, paid training and the chance to work independently in your own community.

In order to qualify to be a census worker, you must be a U.S. citizen, 18 years of age, have a valid Social Security number, and be a legal permanent resident. Other conditions may apply.

Four testing dates have been scheduled in Freeburg at Freeburg Township Hall located at 203 S. Richland.

- Tuesday, November 24th from 1:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Monday, November 30th from 6:30 p.m. - 9:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, 12/8/09 from 9:00 – 11:30 a.m.
- Friday, 12/11/09 from 5:30 – 8:00 p.m.

You must bring certain documents to the test to verify identity, i.e. U.S. Passport, Permanent Resident Card, Driver's License, etc. To find out more information, please contact www.2010censusjobs.gov or call 866/861-2010.
