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The Public Works Committee Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 14, 2015, by Chairman Dean Pruet. Members present were Chairman Dean Pruet, Trustee Ray Matchett, Trustee Mike Blaies, Mayor Seth Speiser, Village Clerk Jerry Menard (absent), Trustee Elizabeth Niebruegge, Trustee Matt Trout, Trustee Steve Smith, Public Works Director John Tolan, Head Lineman Shane Krauss, Village Administrator Tony Funderburg and Office Manager Julie Polson. Guest present: Janet Baechle.

A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Approval of December 10, 2014 minutes: Trustee Ray Matchett motioned to approve the December 10, 2014 minutes and Trustee Mike Blaies seconded the motion. All voting yea, the motion carried.
2. Sewer project: Tony talked to Fred Helms who is still waiting for something from his brother Matt. His brother wants to talk to someone in Florida and it will be a couple of weeks before they know anything. Mayor Speiser believes we need to set a deadline and advise Helms that is it. Tony asked Larry Rhutasel about our permit and it expires October 22, 2015. Tony advised Attorney Manion to get involved with this issue because we've given all we can.
3. Sewer issues: Public Works Director John Tolan reported they cleaned all the problem areas last month. We try to do this every six weeks.
4. Water main extension along Rentchler Road: Mayor Speiser said there is nothing new to report.
5. Countryside Lane annexations: Tony said the title search was done and showed that Smithton Township owns the road. At this point, we need Belleville to quit claim deed the road over to us. The original paperwork that changed the ownership from Belleville to Smithton Township never went through. Smithton Township said if Belleville does that, then they will do the same so we can take over the road. Tony has a call into Mayor Eckert but believes it will be Belleville's attorney that will make a decision on it.
6. GIS Implementation: Tony confirmed Rhutasel is giving us the file we need, and once we have that, we will be close to getting this done.
7. SLM Water Issues: John will discuss this under New Business.
8. FSH Minutes: None at this time.

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9. West Treatment Plant Exception: John had another visit from the EPA inspector yesterday and everything went very well. This was a follow up visit to review the work done to rehab the lift station and pumping out the sludge from the lagoon. We are going to incur some costs from Rhutasel because EPA is asking for several pieces of documentation to complete the inspection. Rhutasel will be charging us for providing that documentation to EPA.
10. Water Tower Painting: We received two bids for the water tower painting and Trikote came in lowest at \$288,000.

Trustee Mike Blaies motioned to recommend to the full Board Trikote's bid for the water tower painting be accepted not to exceed \$228,000 and Trustee Ray Matchett seconded the motion. All voting yea, the motion carried.

John advised Haier Plumbing was going to be out today to replace valves in the main lift station at the plant but had to reschedule.

B. NEW BUSINESS:

1. Public Notice Requirement for Water Violation: John advised we entered into the compliance agreement for samples that came back over the limit in December. With the reporting, we run a yearly running average, so when we got hit with the high level, it raised our average. Since our average is higher, we have to send out another public notice and a letter to every water customer. This time, John will go out to the schools, nursing home, assisted living and explain what is going on. He is going to write the public notice and have Mary Reed at EPA review it before he sends it out. He has tested our entry level water and it was fine. He gave the example if you drank the water every day for 70 years, you may have an increased risk of cancer if the levels were high. Our levels are fine. The notice requirements are mandated by the federal government and you cannot obtain a waiver. With these issues going on, Mary from EPA recommended getting an engineer in here to review our system. There may be a more effective way to treat our chloroform, rather than flushing our system every 10 days. John would like to contact Curry and Associates and set up a meeting with them.

Dear Mr. Funderburg:

The Restricted Status and Critical Review Lists were developed to give additional notice to officials of Public Water Supplies which are or may be close to being in violation of the Illinois Pollution Control Board Rules and Regulations, 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Subtitle F: Public Water Supplies Chapter I, of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

The Restricted Status List will include all Public Water Supplies for which the Agency has information indicating a violation of any of the following requirements: finished water quality requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Part 611 Subpart F; raw water quantity requirements of 35 Ill. Adm. Code, Section 611.115, or maintenance of adequate pressure on all parts of the distribution system under all conditions of flow or maintenance of treatment facilities capable of providing water "assuredly adequate in quantity" both as required by Section 18 of the Act.

A public water supply on the Restricted Status List will not be issued permits for water main extensions where the water mains would extend an existing violation to new users except for certain limited situations, or unless the supply has been granted a variance from the Illinois Pollution Control Board for the violations, or from permit issuance requirements of Section 39 of the Act.

A supply will be placed on the Critical Review List when Agency records indicate that it is approaching any of the violations which would place it on the Restricted Status List. Both lists will be published at least quarterly.

Before a public water supply is placed on either list, the Permit Section will contact the officials of that water supply and inform them that their water supply is about to be placed on the pertinent list. At the same time, details of the violation will be provided to the water supply officials. They also will be provided the opportunity to show that the information available in the Agency files is in error and to show any other reason why the water supply should not be included on either the Restricted Status List or the Critical Review List. For your reference, attached is a copy of Technical Policy Statements, 35 Ill. Adm. Code 652.401 and 652.402.

Our records indicate that your public water supply has exceeded the MCL for total trihalomethanes. (35 IAC Section 611.312(b)(2)(A))

Because of the above, it will be necessary to place the name of your public water supply on the Restricted Status List, which will be published in the April 2015 edition of the Illinois Pollution Control Board's Environmental Register. The name of your supply will remain on the list until such time as the deficiency is corrected or a variance from the rules is obtained from the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Should you wish to discuss this matter further please contact the writer no later than February 28, 2015.

SUBPART D: RESTRICTED STATUS AND CRITICAL REVIEW

Section 652.401 Basis of restricted Status and Critical Review

Pursuant to Section 39(a) of the Act and 35 Ill. Adm. Code 652.111, the Agency shall not issue permits for water main extension construction where the water mains would extend an existing violation of the Environmental Protection Act, 35 Ill. Adm. Code: Subtitle F, Chapter I, or the Agency Rules for Public Water Supplies.

(SOURCE: Amended at 23 Ill. Reg. 8989, effective July 29, 1999.)

Section 652.402 Notification of Restricted Status or Critical Review Status

- a) The Agency shall publish in the Environmental Register at intervals of not more than three months, list of those community water supplies which the Agency's records indicate are subject at that time to the restriction on new water main extensions on Section 652.401. This list will be entitled the "Restricted Status List".
- b) The Agency shall also publish at the same frequency as the Restricted Status List, a list of those community water supplies which Agency records indicate are approaching the point of violating any of the standards listed in Section 652.401. This list will be entitled the "Critical Review List".
- c) Both lists shall include a statement of the potential or existing violation(s) in each community water supply.
- d) Owners of community water supplies which have been placed on Restricted Status or Critical Review shall notify any person requesting construction of a water main extension of this status.

SUBPART E: ALGICIDE PERMIT

Section 652.501 Algicide Permit Requirements

An algicide permit shall be obtained from the Agency before copper sulfate can be applied to a surface water source.

Section 652.502 Permit Applications

- a) Application for an algicide permit shall be made to the Division of Public Water Supplies Permit Section on forms available from the Division.
- b) The application shall include:
 - 1) location and volume of the body of water;
 - 2) name of source stream (if any);
