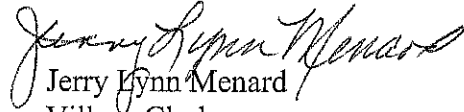

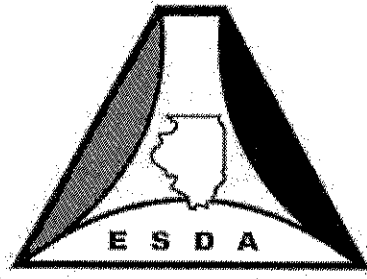

FREEBURG VILLAGE BOARD MEETING ZONING REPORT

November 21st, 2022

Matt Trout Zoning Administrator

All major structures at the Sewer Plant have been constructed. Guarantee has started to set control panels and switch boards. Freeburg Electric has set the main transformer for the plant. Southwest has started to pour the blower pads. Haier set the valve vault by the wet well. Windows should arrive the first week of December. John and myself have met with Durkin several times over the SCADA system for the plant.

Work has begun on the partial demo of the duplex on Southgate and I have met with the owner about his building permit. The homeowners of the Old Freeburg Rd property have hired a company to demo their property the week after Thanksgiving and I have spoken with a company about their home replacement needs.

We will have three hearings at the Combined Board Meeting on December 13th. Those hearings will be for 2 variances and a zoning code change. The first will be for a metal carport on Kessler Rd, the second will be for the zoning change dealing with B2 design standards instead of just on 13/15, and the last will be the Wolf Rd Wetlands hearing for a variance.

Mudd Insurance will be having an open house and ribbon cutting on Tuesday December 29th from 4pm to 8pm. Freeburg Country Mart Holiday Extravaganza will be held on December 3rd from 7-9:30p. The Lighted Christmas Parade will be held on December 4th. The Freeburg Chamber Holiday Party will be at Next Up on December 9th in the late afternoon. More information will be provided as it becomes available.

ELECTRIC COMMITTEE MEETING (Blaies/Albers/Heap/Meehling) Wednesday, November 16, 2022 at 5:30 p.m.

The meeting of the Electric Committee was called to order at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 16, 2022 by Chairperson Mike Blaies. Committee members present were Chairman Mike Blaies, Trustee Denise Albers, Trustee Mike Heap, Trustee Lisa Meehling, Mayor Seth Speiser (5:34 p.m.), Village Clerk Jerry Menard, Trustee Bob Kaiser, Trustee Ray Matchett, Public Works Director John Tolan, Police Chief Mike Schutzenhofer (absent), Head Lineman Shane Krauss, Zoning Administrator Matt Trout, Village Attorney Fred Keck, Village Administrator Tony Funderburg and Office Manager Julie Polson. Guest present: Janet Baechle. There were no guests present via Zoom.

A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Approval of October 12, 2022 Minutes: Trustee Denise Albers motioned to recommend to the full Board approval of the October 12, 2022 minutes, and Trustee Lisa Meehling seconded the motion. All voting yea, the motion carried.
2. Customer Issues: Head Lineman Shane Krauss reported an outage at a new home where our wire was cut when they were trenching for downspouts. We had another outage for on 11/5 when Freeburg experienced some high winds. Public Works Director John Tolan reported a resident at 23 Deerfield Court has a meter issue. The electric usage is very high. Shane can't find any issue with the meter. He switched it out with a used one, and the reading dropped a bit. John advised the resident to have an electrician check their home. We did send the meter to our distributor who has a lab to test it.
3. IMEA Energy Efficiency Grant: The high school is supposed to reach out to Rodd at IMEA. We haven't heard anything.
4. Generator Upgrades: Shane advised the south sub is done as far as the individual controls for the generators. After the north sub is done, we will complete the work on the south sub to ensure the generators at both plants work together. Shane believes we are close to being done. He will not put the generators back in service until January after everything is completed and are working with no issues. We will incur penalties if we put them back in service and they don't perform correctly.

Shane has not heard back from the Barber Lane resident wanting to switch to our power. Village Administrator Tony Funderburg advised Computron is working with the Fire Department on the fiber issue. Shane believes the resident on Rock Hill is all electric, and they won't exceed their load. Their solar system production is not greater than their yearly usage.

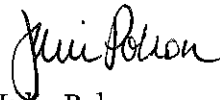
B. NEW BUSINESS: Julie reported two of our outstanding claims have been settled. The accident where the hydrant was struck on High was paid in full in the amount of \$3,713.93, and the claim on N. State and Peabody was paid in full in the amount of \$14,987.82.

John advised he and Mayor Speiser are attending the 2023 APPA Rally. IMEA held a strategic planning meeting for two days last week. They focused on their goals for the next 15 – 20 years. they plan on retiring Prairie State in 2035 and Trimble County in 2040. They are propping the IMEA communities cover 10% of the load in solar or some type of renewable energy. In order for IMEA to move forward with more renewables, they need members to renew their contracts through 2050. Tony said to look at other areas of our country and Germany to see where laws have been enacted regarding zero carbons and see that it goes dark pretty quickly. John said 74% of our load is through coal fire, and IMEA believes one of the plants will be in service after 2035. Tony commented the wind farms are not producing like they were projected to, and Shane advised it is the same with solar. John said IMEA is at 11% with renewables and the state is at 4%. He further said the big question in extending the contract what is IMEA going to pay us for the capacity to have the generators. Tony believes the State of Illinois does not want IMEA. They want to be able to control the power for everyone and buy from them.
