Chairperson Lisa Meehling called the meeting of the Personnel and Public Safety Committee to order on Wednesday, April 27, 2022 at 6:07 p.m. Those present were Chairperson Lisa Meehling, Trustee Mike Blaies, Trustee Mike Heap, Trustee Ray Matchett, Mayor Seth Speiser, Village Clerk Jerry Menard, Trustee Denise Albers, Trustee Bob Kaiser, Village Attorney Fred Keck (absent), Chief Mike Schutzenhofer, Public Works Director John Tolan, Zoning Administrator Matt Trout, Village Administrator Tony Funderburg and Office Manager Julie Polson. Guest present: Janet Baechle. There were no guests present via Zoom.

### POLICE:

#### A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. School Resource Officer for Freeburg High School: Village Administrator Tony Funderburg and Mayor Seth Speiser have a meeting tomorrow morning with grade and high schools. Attorney Keck will review the agreement before we move forward.
2. Part-Time Police Officer Hire: Nothing new to report.
3. Sale of Police Cars: Chief Schutzenhofer confirmed one car should be ready soon.

**B. NEW BUSINESS:** Tony advised Metro East Auto Theft Task Force has purchased a truck for Terry, and it has added to our insurance policy.

### PERSONNEL:

#### A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Approval of March 30, 2022 Minutes: Trustee Mike Heap motioned to approve the March 30 2022 minutes, and Trustee Ray Matchett seconded the motion. All voting yea, the motion carried.
2. Lifeguard Hires of Riley Smith and Sebastian Skaer: Chairperson Meehling advised we are going to hire all remaining pool personnel.

*Trustee Mike Blaies motioned to recommend to the full Board hiring Scott Schulz, Corbin Schwable and Irelynne Loesche as pool managers with a 2.5% raise; concession stand workers Luke Brandt, Claire Schopp, Josie Schwable and Jack Walters at \$12.00 per hour; lifeguards Gracie Mullins, Sebastian Skaer and Riley Smith at \$12.00 per hour pending successful completion of the lifeguard certification class; returning lifeguards Lauren Holcomb, Rachel King, Alaina Levy, Claire Mullins, Jenna Spanely, Carmen Stein, Brooke Trentman and Grace Vahlkamp at \$12.00 per hour, and Trustee Ray Matchett seconded the motion. All voting yea, the motion carried.*

**B. NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Ordinance #1742: An Ordinance Authorizing the Mayor to Execute and the Village to Enter into a Successor Collective Bargaining Agreement with the Policemen's Benevolent Labor Committee: Tony recommends moving forward with this ordinance and have Attorney Keck review and clarify the health insurance language.



He also provided information from Clearwave Fiber on their program to run fiber to everyone in town. They informed Tony they want to permit and locate 5,000 feet per day, and also stated we have to move fast. Tony commented we don't have the staff to handle that. This will be discussed in future meetings.
