VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR  
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The meeting of the Public Property Committee was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20, 2011, in the Municipal Center. Those in attendance were Chairman Ray Matchett, Trustee Mike Blaies, Trustee Rita Baker, Mayor Ray Danford, Village Clerk Jerry Menard, Assistant Public Works Director John Tolan, Village Administrator Dennis Herzing and Office Manager Julie Polson. Guests present: Sheila Gallagher, Mike Gallagher, Bonnie Watters and Bill Reichert.

Chairman Matchett amended the agenda in order to accommodate the public present at the meeting. Sheila Gallagher stated they are going to be holding a competitive run in conjunction with the chili cookoff on October 15th to benefit the veterans. The run will start at noon on Cemetery Road east to Barber Lane, south on Barber Lane to Old Fayetteville Road, and west on Old Fayetteville Road back to the park. They are requesting the Village's cooperation in closing Cemetery Road from the park east up to the hill on Cemetery. Dennis advised Sheila and Mike that parts of Cemetery Road are owned by the County and Freeburg Township as well as the Village. The committee was okay with the request. Dennis will ask Mel to talk to his contacts at the County to see if this request can be granted.

Bonnie Watters was present to ask if we would consider allowing Village employees to work on setting up the tractor/truck pull during work hours. She stated this event brings in a lot of revenue and hopes our position from last year will change. Dennis said last year, any Village employee could donate their time after hours to prepare for the event and also allowed Village equipment to be used. Dennis suggested Rich Darmstatter be contacted since he is retired and could work anytime. Bonnie told the committee Matt Dintelmann will be working on the event again this year and said the Freeburg Junior Midget Football team has also volunteered to help. The committee agreed to offer the use of Village equipment and for any employee that wanted to donate their time after hours. They felt there was sufficient time to get the work done since homecoming isn't until August 19th and 20th.

### POOL: A.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

1. Pool: Bill Reichert was present to provide an update to the pool renovation. He said they had Rhutasel perform some survey work to locate the existing utilities. We need to talk to the Park District regarding the purchase of additional land to accommodate the pool project and that needs to be done as soon as possible. Bill will get the legal description to Dennis. Bill said there are some logistical issues that need to be discussed with respect to the electric service. We will set up a meeting with our electric guys and theirs to work everything out. The pool lift station will be rebuilt and it was decided to replace the clay tile with pvc pipe to the pool lift station. The lighting of the pool was discussed and the committee liked Bill's suggestion of underwater lights. Bill suggested we go out for bid the same time we send the plans to the State for review. Dennis advised the committee we could get a 6-month extension of the pool grant if needed.

2. Narrowbanding Deadline: Julie believes Gene talked to the pool managers. Item can be taken off the agenda.

**B. NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Pool Accident Report Form: Julie said we have not heard anything from the family.

2. Pool Inspection: John said the ladder was repaired and the other items will be taken care of with the renovation of the pool.

**STREETS: A. OLD BUSINESS:**

1. Approval of June 15, 2011 minutes: *Trustee Mike Blaies motioned to approve the June 15, 2011 minutes and Trustee Rita Baker seconded the motion.* All voting aye, the motion carried.

2. Safe Routes to School: Dennis advised Marsha Maller has sent the letter to IDOT formally requesting a change in scope of the project to move the crosswalk to the intersection of Main and State Street.

3. 709 Saxony lane request for culvert: Nothing new.

4. Leaves/limb pickup: One bed has been cleaned out.

5. Welcome to Freeburg sign: Dennis said in order to get this moving along, he will send a letter to RuAnna Stumpf enclosing a drawing that will show where we want to place the "Welcome to Freeburg" sign.

6. MFT: John said we are set to oil on July 29th and August 1st. We received an additional \$17,000 from the state and will address other areas later on in August. A listing of the streets to be taken care of is attached to the packet.

7. Sidewalk requests: John said we'll take care of the sidewalk requests in the August - September timeframe. He contacted Beelman and is getting a better price on the concrete from them.

8. Vacation of streets by high school: Dennis needs Gale Hake to prepare a legal description for the vacation. He also needs to talk to Ron to decide which easements need to be retained by the Village.

9. Procedure to Request Flags to be Displayed: We have not had a chance to work on this.

**B. NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Drainage at 308 W. Phillips: John said he, Ron and Dennis looked at this situation. It is a nightmare drainage issue and the whole area is a mess. It was the consensus of the committee that we need an engineer to look at this and it needs to be put on the to do list. Dennis suggested we have Pat Netemeyer come out and evaluate it.

2. 4-Mile Run in Conjunction with Chili Cookoff: Discussed above.

**C. GENERAL CONCERNS:** We received a request from Faith Baptist Church requesting the Village donate a family pass for the Carruthers family that has been on a missionary visit to Africa.

*Trustee Rita Baker motioned to donate a family pass to the pool for the Carruthers family and Trustee Mike Blaies seconded the motion. All voting aye, the motion carried.*

We received a request from St. Paul's UCC to temporarily close Belleville Street between E. St. Clair Street and White Street on Sunday, September 1st, from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. for their church picnic.

*Trustee Rita Baker motioned to recommend to the full Board Belleville Street be closed on September 1, 2011 for St. Paul's UCC Church Picnic and Trustee Mike Blaies seconded the motion. All voting aye, the motion carried.*

Koppes sent a letter stating he disagrees with our position of not intending to be responsible for the maintenance of the light at Freeburg Center. Dennis doesn't know if we can contractually refuse to pay for the repair. Ray stated his opinion is it is not our position to maintain the light. Dennis will talk to IDOT to see if we can amend the agreement not to maintain the light or possibly remove the light.

The culvert on Main Street was discussed. Dennis said he had TWM check with IDOT to see if it can be included in the Safe Routes to School grant and they said no. Dennis thinks there might not be as big of a problem if the ditch on the other side of the street hadn't been cleaned out and properly maintained. We could clean it out again to try to protect Main Street. It would cost between \$40,000 - \$50,000 to install a larger culvert. John believes there is a problem there and thinks this could be another area for Netemeyer to look at. Mayor Danford said we have problem areas that need to be addressed and it would be prudent to tie in several of the problem areas into a study. Dennis said he will look at TWM's hydraulic calculations for the box culvert going in to see if it will handle what is coming through the fields to Main Street.

Dennis said we generally receive \$100,000 annually in MFT funds. In order to budget for a storm water project, we could borrow money from the bank or possibly look at adjusting our sewer rates. Mayor Danford would like us to meet with an engineer and come up with a plan in the next month or so.

**D. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:** See above.

**E. ADJOURN:** *Trustee Rita Baker motioned to adjourn the meeting at 8:45 p.m. and Trustee Mike Blaies seconded the motion. All voting aye, the motion carried.*

The meeting of the Public Property Committee was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 15, 2011, in the Municipal Center. Those in attendance were Chairman Ray Matchett, Trustee Mike Blaies, Trustee Rita Baker, Public Works Director Ron Dintelmann, Assistant Public Works Director John Tolan, Village Administrator Dennis Herzing and Office Manager Julie Polson.

## POOL: A.

### OLD BUSINESS:

1. Pool renovation: John said the pool season is going well. Everything is running smoothly. Rhutasel will be out to start the surveying for the topo project. Dennis informed the committee of the potential glitch with the pool bond. Our bond counsel is not sure if the notice used by St. Clair County is acceptable according to state statute. They were sent the Candidates Guide as well as the Certificate of Publication issued by the Freeburg Tribune and have also been put in contact with the St. Clair County Election Department. If we can't get them to agree sufficient notice was provided, we will have to conduct a backdoor referendum and pass an ordinance at Monday night's board meeting.

Julie asked the committee if the Village would give free season passes to the pool for employees. We did this a couple of years ago and only had a few families take advantage of it.

*Trustee Rita Baker motioned to recommend to the full Board full-time employees of the Village be given free season passes to the pool and Trustee Mike Blaies seconded the motion. All voting aye, the motion carried.*

## B. NEW BUSINESS:

1. Narrowbanding Deadline: Gene received the grant and is working on this. Ron advised Gene is in the process of scheduling a meeting with the pool managers to review the radios.

2. Quote for Pool Rehabilitation Topo: Dennis said this is needed and told Bill Reichert to go ahead with it. It is a reasonable fee for the scope of work.

## STREETS: A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Approval of May 18, 2011 minutes: *Trustee Rita Baker motioned to approve the May 18, 2011 minutes and Trustee Mike Blaies seconded the motion. All voting aye, the motion carried.*

3. 709 Saxony lane request for culvert: Nothing new.
4. Leaves/limb pickup: The guys have cleaned out one of the beds and are working on this.
5. Welcome to Freeburg sign: Dennis will contact RuAnna Stumpf from IDOT to set up a meeting for her to come out and decide on the spot for the sign.
6. MFT: Ron said all the paperwork is back and the MFT dates have been set for July 29th and August 1st. The highest problem areas will be addressed.
7. Sidewalk requests: A request has been received from Grau-Winterbauer-Bechard-Lehman on N. Alton Street. It will be added to the list to take care of later this summer/fall.
8. Vacation of streets by high school: We met with Mr. Lehman and told him we were going to vacate the street and he didn't have a problem with it. He would like to advise the Board of Education of our plans and will get back to us once he has done so. Dennis said regardless of how they feel, we still need to vacate the streets.
9. Procedure to Request Flags to be Displayed: John said we need to come up with a protocol on this. We did verify with APPA, our guys can be in the back of the bucket truck when putting up the flags as long as the truck travels at a low rate of speed. We will come up with a form and bring it to the next committee meeting. Something will have to be published to notify the public.

**B. NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Citizen Complaints: Tracy Gardiner of 408 N. Vine stated the ditch on her side yard and alleyway floods when it rains - John and Ron will look at it; David and Jennie Wicklman of 303 E. Temple stated their culvert needs replacing because the water does not drain correctly - John said they will put it on the list to do; and Shannon Trentman complained about having to pay out-of-town rates for pool passes since they have a business in Freeburg. Both Dennis and Julie explained we have always based the issuing of pool passes on the family residence address. Request was denied by the committee.

**C. GENERAL CONCERNS:** Ron said we will keep the closing date of the pool as 8/14/11. Towers Fire requested the back road be blocked off for an Open House on October 13, 2011 which various fire departments would attend. Dennis will contact them to confirm exactly what portion of the road they want blocked off.

With regards to the box culvert removal and replacement, it would not be eligible for the SRTS funding. The undersized culvert would be a drainage issue without the sidewalks being constructed (not caused by or an effect of the sidewalks being built).

The Village can include the work with the sidewalk contract, but the costs should be paid with other funds. The Village can use their MFT funds for this purpose.

I think the current plan is to tie in to that structure with the new storm sewers. I don't suppose there would be any chance of justifying replacement of the existing box culvert with a larger one as part of the project. Please advise.

Below is IDOT's response to the site meeting that was held in early May. The department responsible for Safe Routes to School Grants has reviewed Freeburg's project. The detailed version is below. The short version is that IDOT will allow for Freeburg to complete a scope change to include a crosswalk at State Street, but IDOT doesn't believe the crosswalk at Belleville Street meets the intent of the program since it doesn't address children walking to school. It addresses children being dropped off at school.

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) will provide local agencies with the second installment of the \$500 million local government component of the Illinois Jobs Now! capital bill program. This second installment consists of \$100 million that will be distributed based on the regular Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) formula. This \$100 million distribution represents approximately 17% of additional funding beyond the normal annual MFT allotment the local agencies receive. Distribution allotments may be viewed on-line at <http://www.dot.il.gov/blr/100mil/map.aspx>.

Funds received from this \$100 million installment must be deposited into the local agencies' MFT accounts and expended in accordance with MFT standards, policies and procedures.

We anticipate that the local agencies will receive this additional funding by mid August 2011.



We are planning a 4 Mile Run (Competitive & Fun Run/Walk) in conjunction with the chili cook off, on Saturday, October 15, 2011. The purpose of this added event is to draw more guests to the chili cook off, promote physical fitness within our community and raise money for Veterans.

The location and course are as follows: Start on Cemetery Road on the north side of the park. Proceed east 1 ½ miles to Barber Lane. Turn right on Barber Lane to Old Fayetteville Road approximately 1 mile. Turn right on Old Fayetteville Road and finish in the main entrance of the park.

There will be 6 competitive classes each for the men and women. They are ages 19 and under, 20 to 29, 30 to 39, 40 to 49, 50 to 59, and 60 on up. Commemorative medals will be awarded to the top 3 finishers over all in the men's and in the women's plus in each age group we will award 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishers. That is a total of 42 awards in the competitive run.

Entry fee will be \$15.00 per individual. Each pre-registration will be guaranteed an event T-shirt within their registration packet. Same day registration will not be guaranteed a T-shirt and will be \$20.00; this includes all runners and walkers. All pre-registrations must be marked on or before September 30<sup>th</sup> in order to guarantee them a T-shirt of their size.

Timing for the event will be performed by Toolen's Running Start of O'Fallon, Illinois for a fee of \$400.00. Toolen's times and sorts all classes by age and sex and it will take approximately one hour after the last competitive runner comes in.

We are also planning a Kids Fun Run that would be 3/10 of a mile (short walking path). It is for all kids 12 and under. Medals would be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, & 3<sup>rd</sup> place and all children would get a ribbon for participating. Each child will have a \$5.00 registration fee that would not include a t-shirt.

We will also be selling sponsorship for the back of the T-shirts with the businesses logo for \$50 or the business can just have their name on the bottom of the back of the shirt for \$25. We will start with Freeburg businesses. If we cannot

fill the shirts then we will branch out to businesses in other communities.

**On traffic control, all runners and walkers will start at the same time, promptly at noon. Twenty two minutes later the fastest runners should start crossing the finish line. If a front runner is running a 6 minute mile he will cross the finish line in 24 minutes, that's 10 miles an hour. So if your slowest walker is shuffling along at 22 1/2 minutes a mile all your contestants will be off the roads within an hour and a half. It can be even less than that if the walkers are directed onto the sidewalks where they begin on Fayetteville Road. The only road we need to shut down to through traffic is Cemetery road for the first 15 minutes.**

**For the rest of the Walk/Run we will have volunteers standing at the cross road of Cemetery/Peabody Road/Barber Lane and Barber Lane/Old Fayetteville Road. At these posts, the volunteers will have water readily available for the runners/walkers so they do not get overheated and to let drivers know to slow down. We can also post signs for the traffic a week in advance to let them know what is going on.**

**We will be contacting the County to see if it is okay to close the portion of their road from the bottom of the Hill to Savannah Oaks. We would like to know if it is okay for the Village of Freeburg to close the other parts for a short period of time.**


