

Part of the east half of the northwest quarter of Section 29, Township 1 South, Range 7 West of the Third Principal Meridian, St. Clair County, Illinois, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at a stone at the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of said Section 29; thence on an assumed bearing of North 88 degrees 52 minutes 20 seconds West on the south line of said quarter-quarter section, a distance of 388.18 feet to a concrete monument at the northwest corner of Lot 7 of FIRST SUBDIVISION OF LUCASH ADDITION, reference being had to the plat thereof recorded in the Recorder's Office of said St. Clair County in Plat Book 61 on page 39; thence North 88 degrees 50 minutes 33 seconds West on the south line of the above referenced quarter-quarter section, a distance of 113.40 feet to an iron pin; thence South 01 degree 08 minutes 42 seconds West, a distance of 22.00 feet to an iron pin; thence North 88 degrees 50 minutes 33 seconds West, a distance of 173.00 feet to an iron pin; thence South 01 degree 09 minutes 27 seconds West, a distance of 221.76 feet to an iron pin on the northerly right-of-way line of Old Fayetteville Road; thence North 63 degrees 58 minutes 52 seconds West on said northerly right-of-way line, a distance of 55.11 feet to an iron pin; thence North 01 degree 09 minutes 27 seconds East, a distance of 198.59 feet to an iron pin; thence North 88 degrees 50 minutes 33 seconds West, a distance of 48.00 feet to an iron pin, the point of beginning of the tract of land herein described; thence North 01 degree 09 minutes 27 seconds East, a distance of 88.00 feet to an iron pin; thence North 45 degrees 54 minutes 18 seconds East, a distance of 68.18 feet to an iron pin; thence North 01 degree 09 minutes 27 seconds East, a distance of 132.00 feet to a point; thence North 67 degrees 47 minutes 33 seconds West, a distance of 84.00 feet to an iron pin; thence South 06 degrees 42 minutes 00 seconds West, a distance of 300.00 feet to an iron pin; thence South 88 degrees 50 minutes 33 seconds East, a distance of 59.37 feet to the point of beginning, containing 0.49 acre, more or less.

The meeting of the Public Property Committee was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 10, 2014, in the Municipal Center. Those in attendance were Chairperson Elizabeth Niebruegge, Trustee Steve Smith, Trustee Dean Pruett, Mayor Seth Speiser, Village Clerk Jerry Menard, Trustee Matt Trout, Trustee Ray Matchett, Trustee Mike Blaies, Public Works Director John Tolan, Head Lineman Shane Krauss, Village Administrator Tony Funderburg and Office Manager Julie Polson. Guest present: Janet Baechle.

POOL: A. OLD BUSINESS: None.

B. NEW BUSINESS: Trustee Niebruegge asked about the kiddie pool features and John advised he is going to have a frame built and place the tarp over the frame to protect them during the winter. Tony said we need to address the bath house floors and said we need to add hot water to the concession area. Tony asked Trustee Smith if we can do the upgrades up front and budget \$25,000 each year to pay them off. Steve asked Tony to talk to Treasurer Vogel since we have several items financed. We will add this to the agenda.

STREETS: A. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Approval of November 12, 2014 Minutes: Trustee Steve Smith motioned to approve the November 12, 2014 Minutes and Trustee Dean Pruett seconded the motion. All voting yea, the motion carried.
2. Safe Routes to School: Tony said the new project is being worked on, and we have the January letting on the sidewalk across from Village Hall.
3. MFT/Ditch on N. Main: John said Rhutasel is working on Main Street. We will be starting next year's MFT in January.
4. Drainage Problem Areas/Southgate Drive/Countryside Lane: John and Tony drove around when we had the 2.5 inches of rain, and said the area by Karla Theis' house drained very well.
5. Shady Lane Dispute: Tony said we are working hard to get this done.
6. Cemetery Road: Nothing new to report.
7. Village Park Gazebo: Trustee Niebruegge said she and Julie are compiling the rental policy on the gazebo and will have it for the next committee meeting.

8. DCEO Sidewalk Grant: tony said we received the final paperwork today for the \$27,000 sidewalk grant. We have 1 year to spend the money. We will need to get this information out to the residents who have dangerous sidewalks they would like fixed.

9. Donation Collection Time Limit: Trustee Trout will get his notes to Tony and Julie so we can get that in ordinance form for board approval.

(E) **Special Speed Limitations on Elevated Structures.** No person shall drive a vehicle over any bridge or other elevated structure constituting a part of a highway at a speed which is greater than the maximum speed which can be maintained with safety to such bridge or structure when such structure is sign-posted.

Upon the trial of any person charged with the violation of this Section, proof of the determination of the maximum speed by the Village and the existence of such signs is conclusive evidence of the maximum speed which can be maintained with safety to such bridge or structure. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-608)

(F) **General Speed Restrictions.** The speed limits on the various streets shall be approved by the Village Board, but shall not exceed **twenty miles per hour (20 MPH)** in a school zone and not to exceed **twenty-five miles per hour (25 MPH)** on a residential street; otherwise, **thirty miles per hour (30 MPH)** on an arterial street unless otherwise posted. (See Schedule "D") (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-604) (See 65 ILCS Sec. 5/11-40-1)

(G) **Special Speed Limit While Passing Schools.** No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of **twenty miles per hour (20 MPH)** while passing a school zone or while traveling upon any public thoroughfare on or across which children pass going to and from school during school days when school children are present.

This section shall not be applicable unless appropriate signs are posted upon streets and maintained by the Village or State wherein the school zone is located. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-605)

(H) **Failure to Reduce Speed.** A vehicle shall be driven upon the streets and alleys of this Village at a speed which is reasonable and proper with regard to traffic conditions and the use of the street or alley. The fact that the vehicle does not exceed the applicable maximum speed limit does not relieve the driver of the duty to decrease speed when approaching and crossing an intersection or when special hazard exists with respect to pedestrian or other traffic or by reason of weather or highway conditions. Speed must be decreased as may be necessary to avoid colliding with any person or vehicle on or entering the highway in compliance with legal requirements and the duty of all persons to use due care.

(I) **Traffic Lane Usage.** Whenever any roadway within the Village has been divided into **two (2)** or more clearly marked lanes for traffic, a vehicle shall be driven as nearly as practicable entirely within a single lane and shall not be moved from such lane until the driver has first ascertained that such movement can be made with safety.

(J) **U-Turns Prohibited.** No driver of a vehicle shall make a "U-turn" on any street or at any intersection of any streets in the Village.

24-4-3 **DUTY TO REPORT ACCIDENT.** The driver of a vehicle which is in any manner involved in an accident within the Village shall, without unnecessary delay, notify the Police Department and shall make a report of such action. Failure to report an accident within the Village within **twenty-four (24) hours** shall result in arrests of the person or persons involved. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-415)

24-4-4 **TRANSPORTING LIQUOR IN VEHICLES.** No person shall transport, carry, possess or have any alcoholic liquor within the passenger area of any motor vehicle in this Village except in the original container and with the seal unbroken. (See 625 ILCS Sec. 5/11-502)

Comments: Regarding the proposed speed limit change (from 30 MPH down to 25 MPH):

I think it is totally unwarranted. First, with the addition of the stop signs at nearly every corner on the side streets, it's silly for drivers to speed to the next stop. Second, the major streets are not patrolled enough as it is to reduce speeding. I never see patrol cars on State St., Main, Urbana, or Apple-Douglas during rush hours and seldom during other daylight hours. The police wouldn't even need set up radar/lidar. They could just drive through town on those streets, automatically reducing the speed of traffic.

Where are the statistics that seem to indicate the need for a reduced limit? How many accidents have occurred on side streets during the last five years, say? And of those, how many drivers were (proven to be) speeding? How many speeding tickets have been issued during the last five years on side streets? How do the statistics compare from year to year? Let's actually prove a need.

We do need to make better use of our police force to control the current speeding situation, especially during daylight hours. They should perhaps pay more attention to drivers failing to come to a complete stop at arterials or not yielding to traffic having the right-of-way. Changing the limit will, in my opinion, do absolutely nothing to promote safer driving. It will just be an added expense to post new signs and rewrite codes.
